### **Getting to Know You**

When Front Desk Greeter Gail Kelly welcomes newcomers to the Cancer Center, she radiates a friendly, upbeat attitude—exactly what is needed in that specialized area of the Bon Secours St. Francis campus. What those newcomers probably don't



suspect, though, is that Gail is a lifetime fitness enthusiast—from summer camp in the Adirondacks in her youth to exercise and yoga in the present.

How does she come to be sitting behind a desk? It's a long story. Gail grew up in Woodmere, New York, and moved to the Charleston area twelve years ago. After enrolling in a medical coding program, she was employed at Bon Secours St. Francis until the coding operations moved to Ladson. She continued her career as a medical coder, working remotely from home.

After retirement, wanting to give back, she signed up as a volunteer at Bon Secours St. Francis. The Cancer Center was a natural fit for Gail; her father died of lung cancer, and her mother is a 2x cancer survivor. Here was the ideal place for her to serve. She has now been greeting patients and families at the front desk for a few months, helping to calm anxieties the moment people come through the door. Walking into a cancer center can be at best intimidating, at worst terrifying for anyone. Gail is the first line of defense for these patients, offering a friendly smile and the reassurance that they need.

Currently, Gail is also training to work in the Infusion Center itself. There she will talk to patients and their companions, fetch blankets, provide snacks, and help out in general. This is a demanding job which calls for sensitivity, warmth, and considerable energy.

Gail's husband grew up in Lynbrook,NY. During Gail's work-from-home years of COVID-19, he developed quite an expertise as a chef, and he still enjoys cooking. The couple has two children (one in Tennessee, one back in Lynbrook) and two grandchildren, aged three and five. When not sitting behind that desk, Gail is, you guessed it, very active. In addition to yoga, Gail is studying for her upcoming Bat Mitzvah that will take place in June. In her spare time, she also enjoys crossword puzzles, biking and bird watching.






